If you know Mr. Anderson, you know that he had no hesitation inspecting what he expected of his staff. He is known as a father figure to hundreds who have attended Betty-Lin and are now grown-up. The foundation was laid and it is no wonder that they are still operating for over 54 years which is a rare testimony for any type of Business in this day and age.

Linard Anderson will definitely be remembered as a sharp dresser and one who had a penchant for fine cologne. He could go from looking like he stepped out of a G Q Magazine to donning rubber fishing gear. He was an avid outdoorsman. He loved fishing and hunting and being in the woods or on the lake fishing with his buddies. His all-time favorite hobby and pastime was playing BINGO.
